The Perry Hotel boasts seventy-nine individually appointed guest rooms, many with private balconies overlooking the crystal clear waters of Little Traverse Bay. The king size mattresses are custom handmade and created by Beds by Design, Harbor Springs. They are firm on one side and soft on the other to suite you.

Rose Dining Room, the casual bar & grille the Noggin Room Pub, where Laura will make you the best Black & Tan this side of Ireland, and a serene outdoor dining area, the Rose Garden Veranda. Memories are made aboard the Pointer-The area which is now the Pointer Room at Stafford's Pier Restaurant in Harbor Springs, Michigan is literally "on the water". Until 1962 it was the boathouse for the Harbor Point Association's water taxi, The Pointer, which ran between Harbor Point and the Village of Harbor Springs. As there are no cars allowed on Harbor Point, The Pointer provided a vital link for the residents of the association during the summer months. There were a total of three different vessels, all named The Pointer, which ran from 1930 until 1962.



In May of 1990, Stafford C. Smith, founder of Stafford's Hospitality, had the last of these gracious yachts relaunched. The completely restored Pointer is now on display outside Stafford's Pier Restaurant, in the exact location where residents and visitors formerly caught the boat for service to the Harbor Point Hotel.
